As a result, AAU students can visit Menlo College for short-term or long-term study. In addition, Menlo College will welcome AAU students who wish to spend a semester or a year or two abroad in its program run on its



campus in Atherton, California, USA, provided they meet the eligibility requirements established by Menlo College.

The AAU students will have three options to study at Menlo College. Option 1: The students upon completing 30 credits with AAU, can continue at Menlo College and complete 60 credits with them, and will return to AAU for the remaining 33 credits.

# AAU President honors elderly citizens and residents on the occasion of the International Day for the Elderly



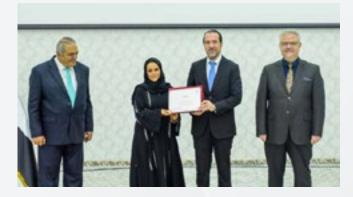
